What We Do

artEquity offers programming that centers the global majority and the needs of Black, Indigenous, People of Color (BIPOC) artists and art leaders, with a throughline of intentional support for Black artists and leaders. Our programs focus on leadership development, community building and strategic support for artists and arts leaders of color, and resources for wellness. We engage an ever-growing alumni network of artists and activists by providing support, mentorship, and timely response as needs arise. Additionally, we provide direct fiscal support to artists and activists in need through our Artist + Activist Community Fund.

History + Impact

artEquity launched in 2015. Our thinking then was to build a base of arts practitioners who could also be activists. With a one-year grant of \$135,000 from the Andrew W. Mellon Foundation, and generous in-kind support from the Oregon Shakespeare Festival, artEquity launched its first National Facilitator Training. Since that initial approach, artEquity has worked closely with hundreds of organizations and thousands of individuals. As we approach our **10th anniversary in 2025**, artEquity's impact is felt throughout the field and has left a meaningful and lasting imprint on the national arts and culture landscape.
